- Create and assist in implementing youth-led strategies and campaigns.
- Attend conference on prevention.
- Develop collaborative partnership with school and community youth groups.
- Attend grant required trainings.
- Attend monthly Local Prevention Council (LPC) meetings.
- Attend grant-related meetings (virtual and at least 4 per year may be in person in Connecticut).
- Help build community coalitions to meet all steps of the Strategic Prevention Framework.
- Provide opportunities for additional youth to work directly with the coalition.
- Represent the coalition on the state/local advisory boards.
- Create a media campaign for parents and peers.

Required Qualifications:

- Applicants need to be in the age range of 16-24.
- A motivated team player who leads by example and demonstrates passion for prevention.
- Passionate about helping their community reduce alcohol misuse among youth.
- Access to reliable transportation.
- Strong interest in substance misuse prevention.
- Ability to engage positively with all stakeholders and community members.
- Experience as a youth in recovery and/or peer advocate/leader preferred.
